The Curriculum

The children are arranged in 4 small mixed age classes, often spending 2 years with the same teacher, which allows strong, supportive relationships to develop. To enable children to reach their full potential we provide:

- A broad, balanced and exciting curriculum
- A wide variety of resources
- Interactive whiteboards in every classroom and a computer suite
- Support staff in every classroom
- Regular staff training for our highly experienced staff
- Careful monitoring of progress and individual support when needed
- The opportunity to work individually, in pairs and in groups
- Opportunities to share and celebrate children's work, achievement and effort through attractive displays and celebration assemblies

We feel that the learning emphasis should be on skills and attitudes, not simply on content. We therefore teach children the qualities that will make them a powerful and effective learner.

- Plays, Concerts and Shows
- Regular visitors to the school sharing expertise and interests

We are developing passions for lifelong learning over a wide range of interests and allowing them to explore the positive contribution that each one of them can make.

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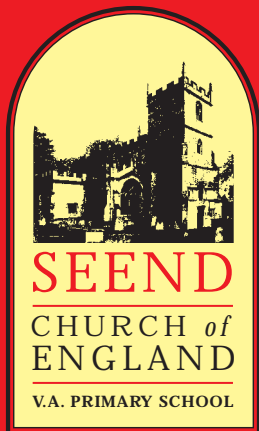


Partnerships

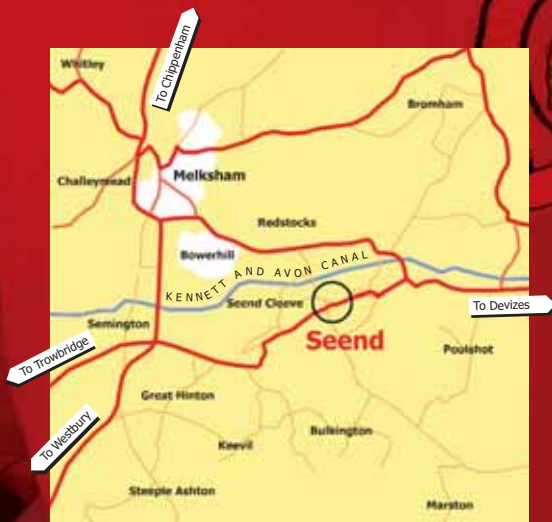
